Annual Report 2014

I cordially welcome you all to the General Body meeting of the Indian Adult Education Association and place before you the Annual Report for the year 2014. This year was a memorable one in the life of the Association as it has completed 75 years and hence, Platinum Jubilee was celebrated in a simple, at the same time in a fitting manner. I am sure with all your cooperation the Association will see the centenary celebration also. I am also happy to report you that we have cooperated and collaborated with a number of institutions including the National Literacy Mission Authority, University Departments of Adult, Continuing Education and Extension, State Resource Centres, Jan Shikshan Sansthan, NGOs and individuals working in the field of adult and lifelong education apart from bringing out our regular publications like IAEA Newsletter, Indian Journal of Adult Education and Proudh Shiksha in time maintaining the quality and contents. We have also published two books which will be of use to students and research scholars. Before I could move forward to explain in detail about the programmes undertaken by the Association, I would like to give you a brief about the National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) which is fundamental to standardize the quality of the vocational skill development training programmes in India.

After the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) came to power in Government of India in May 2014, a lot of importance is given to skill development with the result a separate Ministry has been created for Skill Development & Entrepreneurship. Skilling India is on the top of the agenda of the government. This effort is a fillip to make India abundant with trained workforce who will directly benefit increased production, quality improvement and opportunities for better employment with increased wages. This will also benefit the trained

persons to get better employment opportunities abroad with more emoluments. It is not true that this is the first time skill development has got importance. Infact, every government felt the need and importance of skill development but the priority given varied in different degrees. So to say vocational skill development training got importance right from the beginning in independent India which can be seen in all the Five Year Plan documents. Unfortunately skilling people in a country like India with huge population are a difficult task as a vast majority is working in the unorganized sector. Illiteracy also has compounded the problem little more. However, India has one advantage, i.e. it is a country with young population. According to National Youth Policy 2014 the youth age group has been defined as 15-29 years. As per 2011 Census the total population of India was 121 crore in which the youth population alone was 33.33 crore which was 27.5% of the population. It is expected that the population of India may exceed 130 crore by 2020 with a median age of 28 which will be less than the median ages of China and Japan. Also India is expected to become the fourth largest economy by 2025 contributing around 6% to the world GDP, only after USA, China and Japan which face the risk of an ageing workforce. According to an estimate the working population of India is expected to increase to 59.2 crore by 2020 (China will have 77.6 crore) which will make a significant contribution to the economic development of the country.

The importance of skill development has been stressed by various committees and commissions but the most important one is the Education Commission of 1964-1966 constituted by the Govt. of India under the Chairmanship of Professor D.S.Kothari. The report of the commission clearly states that India is in transition from a society in which education is a privilege of a small minority to one in which it could be made available to the masses of the people. The immense resources needed for this programme can be generated only if education is related to productivity so that an expansion of education leads to an increase in national income which, in its turn, may provide the means for a larger investment in education. India's enormous resources of manpower can only become an asset in the modern world, when trained and educated.

Eventhough, a large number of organizations offer vocational skill development training programmes in India, the quality and content varies from one to the other and in most cases the certificates issued to persons undergone such training programmes have no validity/recognition in the employment market. Hence, many times people undergone the training finally land in unorganized sectors which mostly offer low wages. In order to improve the quality of training and bring-in the component of recognition both in India and abroad the Govt. of India, Ministry of Finance, Department of Economic Affairs issued a notification for National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) on December 27, 2013 which organizes qualifications according to a series of levels of knowledge, skills and aptitude. These levels are defined in terms of learning outcomes which the learner must possess regardless of whether they are acquired through formal, non-formal or informal learning. In that sense it is a quality assurance Framework.

Some of the key elements of the National Skill Qualification Framework are:

- National principles for recognizing skill proficiency and competencies at different levels leading to international equivalency
- Multiple entry and exist between vocational education, skill training, general education, technical education and job markets
- Progression pathways defined within skill qualification framework
- Opportunities to promote lifelong learning and skill development
- Partnership with industry/employers
- A transparent, accountable and credible mechanism for skill development across various sectors
- Increased potential for recognition of prior learning.

It is beneficial to schools, vocational education and training providers, higher education institutes, accrediting authorities as well as industry and its representative bodies, unions, professional associations and licensing authorities. The biggest beneficiaries are the learners who can judge the relative value of a qualification at a particular level on the framework and make informed decisions about their career progression paths. The Framework is to ensure quality and standards to meet sectors specific requirements.

NSQF levels are not related directly to years of study. They are defined based on the professional knowledge, professional skill, core skill and responsibility. Over a lifetime of learning, individuals can move to higher levels or across levels of qualifications as they take on new learning and acquire new skills. Each level is defined by a set of descriptors expressed as learning outcomes. National Occupational Standards (NOS) define the measurable performance outcomes required from an individual engaged in a particular task. The competency based curriculum package consists of syllabus, student manual, trainers' guide, training manual, trainers' qualifications, assessment and testing guidelines and multimedia package and e-material. These are to be developed for each NSQF level. The curricula for the courses are modular one, allowing for skills accumulation and facilitating exit and entry. Since NSQF is based on an outcomes-based approach participation of industry and employers is critical for its success. Vocational education, vocational training, general education and skill development courses will be designed, developed, delivered and learners assessed and certified in accordance with NSQF with Sector Skills Councils (SSCs), industry and employers. NSQF will provide a means of articulation and alignment of the Indian Skill Qualification levels with those of other countries and regions. This will help in the mobility of Indian NSQF aligned qualification holders to work in and/or relocate to other parts of the world.

I earnestly appeal to all the members of Indian Adult Education Association to understand the importance of National Skill Qualification Framework and the need for standardized vocational skill development programmes. For more information you may like to see the materials in Internet and update your knowledge periodically.

Now I would like to give the detailed account of the programmes and activities conducted by the Association during the year 2014 which are as follows:

All India Adult Education Conference at Udaipur



The 60th All India Adult Education Conference was held at Udaipur in collaboration with Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth (Deemed) University from January 10-12, 2014. The theme of the conference was **Lifelong Learning in Higher Education**. Around 250 delegates attended the conference from all over India.

The conference was inaugurated by Dr. (Smt.) Kamla Ji, Governor of Gujarat and presided over by Prof. B.S. Garg, Chancellor, Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth (Deemed) University and President, Indian Adult Education Association. Others spoke on the occasion were Prof. O.P. Gil, Vice Chancellor, Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, Prof. S. S. Sarangdevot, Vice Chancellor, Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth (Deemed) University and Shri K.C. Choudhary, General Secretary, Indian Adult Education Association.



There were five plenary sessions out of which the first one was devoted to Keynote address by Dr. Asoke Bhattacharya, former Professor of Jadavpur University, Kolkata. In the absence of Dr. Bhattacharya his address was read by Dr. V. Mohankumar, Director, IAEA. This





session was chaired over by Dr. M.C. Reddeppa Reddy, Professor, Department of Adult and Continuing Education, Sri Venkateswara University, Tiruputi. In the remaining four sessions 28 papers were presented on various sub-topics relating to the theme of the conference. These sessions were chaired by Dr. Madan Singh,

Treasurer, IAEA, Dr. V. Reghu, former Head, Centre for Adult and Continuing Education, University of Kerala, Dr. P. Adinarayana Reddy, Professor, Department of Adult and Continuing Education, Sri Venkateswara University, Tiruputi and Shri Sudhir Chatterjee, Vice President, IAEA.

As part of the conference a Cultural Programme was held at Gajvan, Udaipur in which artists from Kalakar Orchestra Group presented different dances which reflected the rich culture of Rajasthan. A few delegates of the conference also gave programmes in the cultural event.



The concluding session was presided over by Prof. S.S. Sarangdevot and the Valedictory address was given by Prof. B.S. Garg. He also released a book titled "आप ठीक कहते हैं" (Aap Theek Kahte Hain) written by Smt. Lakshmi Rupal, one of the Tagore Literacy Award Winners. On this occasion Shri K.C. Choudhary, newly elected President of IAEA, Shri Champa Lal Yadav,



Dr. D. Uma Devi, Smt. Lakshmi Rupal and Dr. O.P.M. Tripathi shared their views about the conference. Dr. V. Mohankumar, Director, IAEA proposed the vote of thanks.



The Udaipur Declaration and Recommendations drafted by a committee was read by Dr. Madan Singh. They were as follows:

We, the delegates of the Sixtieth All India Adult Education Conference held at Udaipur, Rajasthan from January 10-12, 2014 resolved to re-dedicate ourselves for the promotion and development of Lifelong Learning through all our programmes and activities.

We as individuals and representing organizations will serve the common people through community development activities and training programmes to enable them to pursue further education and skill development so that they have both horizontal and vertical mobility in their life which inturn will benefit not only the individuals, their families but also the community as a whole.

Hence, our recommendation is:

1. Lifelong learning should be an integral part of the system of education and should be given equal importance to that of formal education.
2. Prior learning should be recognized and persons who have acquired the skills through non-formal/informal system of education should be assessed and certified by a recognized body.
3. Extension as a third dimension has been already recognized in the university system. But till date extension is not able to be established itself as an equivalent dimension like that of teaching and research. Hence, not only the programmes and activities carried out as part of extension should be given importance but also the departments involved in extension work should also be treated equivalent to the teaching faculty.
4. Eventhough, a large number of programmes under lifelong learning being carried out by individual organizations there found to be no unifying factor with the result there is either lack of or no coordination between them. Hence, the need of the hour is to bring all such organizations under one umbrella for better coordination and cooperation.
5. University Departments of Adult, Continuing Education and Extension/Lifelong Learning should be strengthened with more financial allocation and authority to conduct short-term courses for all categories of persons – non-literates, neo-literates and persons with rudimentary level of education so that the beneficiaries are able to pursue self-employment or wage employment.
6. Extension cannot be the work of one or two departments either in government or in university system. Instead it should be a part and parcel of all the departments so that students pursuing courses in different disciplines are introduced to community services/social education.
7. Lastly, Saakshar Bharat Programme is aiming a learning society with an institutionalized continuing education programme for which whole hearted support should be extended whatever way possible by individuals and institutions.

IAEA Platinum Jubilee Celebration

Indian Adult Education Association established in the year 1939 was 75 years old in the year 2014. Hence, it was the Platinum Jubilee year for the organization. As part of the Platinum Jubilee celebration four Regional Seminars were organized at Ahmedabad, Coimbatore, Kolkata and Mhow (Indore) and at the end a get together at New Delhi. The theme of the seminars was "Adult Education and the Role of NGOs".



The first Regional Seminar was organized at the Old Circuit House, Ahmedabad on October 10, 2014 which was attended by 22 persons and coordinated by Dr. Dilip C. Dave, Life Member of IAEA. While inaugurating the seminar Shri K.C.Choudhary, President, IAEA stressed on the need and importance of lifelong learning for everyone in the community, particularly for the less and non-literates. He desired NGOs to participate more in adult and lifelong education programmes as they have the advantage of already working in the community. He also fondly recalled the services of a number of persons in Gujarat who were not only closely associated with education/adult education/community development but also with IAEA.

Thereafter, three presentations were made. The first one was by Dr.V.Mohankumar, Director, IAEA on the topic "Indian Adult Education Association: Retrospect and Prospects" in which he gave a detailed account of the reason for establishing the Association by a group of academia based on the call given by Mahatma Gandhi, its main objectives, roles and activities, management and finance. The second one was made by Dr. Sandhya Thaker, Director-Professor, Department of Lifelong Education, Gujarat Vidyapith, Ahmedabad who spoke on the outreach activities conducted by the university in general and her department in

particular. The third presentation was made by Dr. Laxmanbhai Avaiya, Director, State Resource Centre, Gujarat Vidyapith in which he explained the role played by his centre in supporting adult education programmes in the state by developing quality teaching-learning material and training the literacy functionaries.

The seminar was presided over by Smt. Dharini A. Shukla, Secretary, Hiraba Kelavani Trust, Ahmedabad who stressed the importance of education for overall development of a person and the country.

At the end Smt. Kalpana Kaushik, Assistant Director, IAEA proposed the vote of thanks.

The second Regional Seminar was held at Coimbatore on October 14, 2014 in collaboration with Avinashilingam Jan Shikshan Sansthan in which around 52 persons participated. The seminar had two sessions – one inaugural and the other presentations. The inaugural session was presided over by Shri S. Somasundaram, Trustee, Avinashilingam Educational Trust who congratulated Indian Adult Education Association for its 75 years service in adult education and wished the organization to continue the service to the community in the years to come also. Shri K.C. 

Zakir Hussain Memorial Lecture

The Zakir Hussain Memorial Lecture 2014 was



delivered by Justice C.S. Dharmadhikari on August 29, 2014 at India International Centre, New Delhi. The topic was भारतीय राष्ट्रियता : वास्तविकता या आभास (Indian Nationalism - a Reality or Fiction). In his thought provoking speech which was heard spell bound by the audience he traced the history of India by quoting elaborately how over the time Indians forgot nationalism and

adopting more of regionalism. It is a well known fact that people following different religions could not live together in peace and hence, Pakistan was created as a separate country. In the same way people speaking different languages could not live together and hence, states were created on the basis of languages. Later on states have also been created on the basis of different cultural identities such as Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand and Telengana. Today situation has become so bad that each state considers itself independent like independent nations with




the result the national character are now being challenged. He further said that it is distressing to see that religion, language, gender discrimination hampering the Indian nationality and the love and affection towards nation. He was emphatic to state that there is a difference between love for the country (Deshbhakti) and love for the nation (Rashtrabhakti). Patriotism is essential but it is not enough in itself. The desire to live together with the fellow citizens is the very basis of nationalism.

Already a volume with the same title was published in 1990 as part of Golden Jubilee of the Journal which contains materials from 1939 to 1989.
- Computerization of Presidential addresses of All India Adult Education Conference held since 1974 has been completed. This will be published with the title "On to Eternity", Vol. IV of 1974. Already 3 volumes with the same title have been published by IAEA.

Certificate in Library Science Course

IAEA is an accredited institution of National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) to conduct certificate course in Library Science. During the period of reporting 6 candidates who have passed examination held in October/November 2013 were given certificates.

Five candidates have appeared in the examination which was held in October – November 2014 for which results are awaited. Twelve new candidates have been enrolled for the course out of which 6 will sit for the examination in April-May 2015

Choudhary, Chancellor of the Institute expressed his happiness that the Institute has planned an international seminar on a theme of contemporary relevance and hoped that the seminar will be followed-up with further activities in different parts of the country. Thereafter, Professor S.Y. Shah, Director of the institute introduced the theme and speakers. Discussing the importance of professionalization of adult education, Professor Shah recollected some of the initiatives taken by Indian Adult Education Association and the Institute in strengthening Adult education as a field of practice and discipline of study through various professional development programmes.

- A two day international seminar on **“Management of Community Projects: Scope and Challenges”** was organized in collaboration with the University of Delhi and Jawaharlal Nehru University on September 11-12, 2014 in the Conference Hall of Indian Adult Education Association. They were also given group assignment which was completed with interest and enthusiasm. At the end the students were given certificate of participation in the seminar.

- Dr. Thomas J. Sork, Senior Associate Dean, International and Administration Professor, Adult Education, The University of British Columbia, Vancouver, Canada and a Distinguished Professor of International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education (IIALE) visited the institute on November 10, 2014 along with Mr. Shapoor Marfatia, Director, Business Development, The University of British Columbia and held discussions with the Professor S.Y.Shah, Director, IIALE on the ongoing activities and possibilities of initiating collaborative programmes with the University of British Columbia and the Institute. Dr. Shah shared the details of collaboration with the Wurzburg University and experiences of the four German students who visited the institute in connection with the research study of academic professionalization of adult education. Professor Sork visited new facilities at IAEA building specially the guest house, seminar and research room and the renovated documentation Center and hoped that the new facilities at the Institute would facilitate the organization of collaborative programmes in course of time. James A. Draper Lecture and Roby Kidd Memorial Lecture

James A. Draper (1930-2004) was one the most distinguished scholars in Canadian adult education history. He belonged to that remarkable generation of adult educators who not only believed in the inherent democracy of adult education, but who also fought to create a space in the academic world for the study of adult learning and tried to work towards professionalization of adult education. He did his doctorate in the field of adult education from the University of Wisconsin, USA in 1964 and joined the Department of Post-graduate Studies in Adult Education at Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE), University of Toronto and served till his retirement in 1995. Draper made important contributions to the history of adult education, adult literacy, community development, and First Nations adult education. He played a



key role in the development of the Canadian Association for the Study of Adult Education, World Literacy of Canada and the Canadian Association for Community Development. He has a number of publications to his credit.

Professor Draper has played an important role in establishing the first University Department of Adult Education in Rajasthan University where he served as a Visiting Professor (1965-67). Since then he has been regularly visiting Indian universities and working towards development of adult education as a field of practice and discipline of study. He was closely associated with Indian Adult Education Association and World Literacy of Canada. His contributions to Indian adult education were recognized by the Rajasthan University by conferring upon him Honorary Doctorate. Keeping in view of his long association with Indian adult education and his manifold contributions, International Institute of Adult and Lifelong Education has been organizing James A Draper Memorial lecture annually.

James Robins Kidd (popularly known as Roby Kidd 1915-82), was an institution by himself. He obtained his Bachelor Degree from Sir George Williams University, Montreal (1938) and Master Degree from McGill University, Montreal, Canada (1943). He received the degree of Doctorate in Education from Columbia University, New York (1947), the first Canadian citizen to have done so in Adult Education.

Starting his career at YMCA as Secretary in 1935, he became the Director of Canadian Association of Adult Education in 1950 and he held the post till 1961. He was consultant for the University of Rajasthan during 1965 to 1966. He was the Chairman of the Department of Adult Education, Ontario Institute of Studies on Education from 1966 to 1982. He was Secretary General of the International Council for Adult Education from 1973 till 1979.

This time in a function organized at India International Centre, New Delhi on August 29, 2014 Professor James A. Draper Memorial Lecture was delivered by Professor Regina Egetenmeyer of the Julius Maximilian University, Wurzburg, Germany on the theme *“Academic Professionalization in Adult and Continuing Education: Theoretical and Empirical Perspectives in Germany and beyond”*. In her lecture, she defined academic professionalization and briefly discussed its various dimensions and some of the challenges and Roby Kidd Memorial Lecture was delivered by Professor Soren Ehlers of the Danish School of Education, Aarhus University, Denmark on the topic *“What Kind of Professionalism is Relevant Today? The Nordic Countries - As a Case”*. In his lecture, he dealt with the association of Professor Robby Kidd with Danish adult educators during the first World conference on Adult Education held at Elsinore in Denmark and discussed the tussle between the officials and non-officials on the importance and role of adult education in Denmark. Further, he touched upon the current professional status of adult education in Denmark in particular and other Nordic countries in general.

Reading Association of India (RAI)

- A meeting of the Reading Association of India (RAI) was held in the office of the Mumbai Chapter of RAI on April 7, 2014 to plan the next Asian Literacy Conference to be held on October 15-16, 2015 at Mumbai. It was attended by the current President Shri H.C. Parikh, past Presidents viz; Shri K. C. Choudhury and Prof. S. Y. Shah, the Chairperson of Western Zone Smt. Kallolini Hazarat and some of the members of RAI. Smt. Hazarat was unanimously nominated as President of RAI from January 2015 and also as the Chairperson of the Conference Committee and Prof. Shah was requested to draft the theme paper for discussion.


